As I reflect back on my past three years at St. Augustine's, I have been deeply moved by the many dedicated people who are working so hard to raise the money to make a dream come true for the future of the children of our Parish. St. Augustine's welcomes its Alumni back

St. Augustine's held its first Alumni event on Sunday, June 13 in the school gym organized by Cathie Oberndorf and Donna O'Hara. The School is trying to get in touch with its alumni in advance of our big 100th anniversary party in 2011 and to create a data bank of contacts for Faith and Foundation and alumni outreach. More than 150 people showed up to reminisce and reconnect after hearing about the event via Facebook and the BC Catholic.

Alumni visitors ranged from two most senior alumni who attended the school in the 1930s to last year's Grade 7 students who just wanted to come back and play in the gym. Another family came from Georgia to visit and reconnect. Gladys Brown, a retired teacher from St. Augustine's, also showed up to make the day.

Donna O'Hara said it was a great experience. "I was waiting in anticipation to see all of the alumni – especially the ones I had taught," she said of the many students who have gone through her classes over the past 17 years – particularly her very first class. "To my surprise I still recognized most of them."

In addition to reconnecting, the school also received boxes of photos from alumni and their families – and heard many stories dating back to the old building.

In the end the event shows the importance of legacy and community to all of us St. Augustine's and the support for a new school.
